What is COMSHIP?

The COMESA Seed Harmonisation
Implementation Plan (COMSHIP) implements
the COMESA Seed Trade Harmonisation
Regulations in order to enhance seed
production, reliability, seed trade including
increasing the competitiveness of the seed
industry in the Southern and East African
Region

Ensuring access of high-quality, certified and registered seeds for farmers across the COMESA region

Through **COMSHIP**, **RECAM**P promotes a comprehensive system for tracking seed sector developments in the COMESA region

Through **COMSHIP**, **RECAMP** promotes a common measurement of "progress" for the COMESA region

RECAMP aims to identify key challenges faced in the seed sector and recommends what needs to be done to improve access to improved and certified seed in COMESA member states, with special attention for smallholder farmers, and where possible use 'lessons learned' in other COMESA countries

Training for improved business management performance and coordination

53 SMEs in Zambia were trained in sourcing local partnerships, focusing on the horticulture sector (fruits and vegetables).

The same type of training will now be rolled out to other COMESA Member States.

This training in Zambia has helped SMEs to supply to larger customers and clients.

Assessment Studies

RECAMP has started work to carry out assessment to generate and analyze baseline data on the current production, markets access and trade, key actors and business environment for the three targeted value chains (horticulture, agro-processing, maize, livestock, fish, dairy, poultry, meat and Leather and Leather products) in the COMESA region.

Capacity Development

RECAMP has conducted capacity development workshops, with the aim of strengthening the human and institutional capacity of COMESA Member States on certification of eco-friendly leather products application of standards for leather value chains, including the design of leather-finishing processes and leather products which meet regulatory and safety standards of the markets, as well as the design of a regional hides and skins traceability systems in line with global development and implementation of the regional hides and skins traceability system.

To date, **RECAMP** has conducted a total of 9 capacity building training workshops.

A total of 56 people from 14 COMESA Member States have thus far been trained.

Trainees were drawn from the public Sector (Ministry of Trade and Industry, Standards authority, Ministry of Agriculture), Academia (training institutions offering leather related programs) and the private sector (enterprises along the leather value chain and leather sector Councils and Associations' representatives).
